# "In the Shelter of the Most High" A Message from Rev. Lynn Blevins

Yesterday's Psalm was No. 91 and it was particularly timely in light of the impending hurricane. Psalm 91 is a hymn of thanksgiving to God for assurance of God's protection. Psalm 91 includes these words:

You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the almighty,

Will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress; my God in whom I trust."

For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence;

He will cover you with his wings and under his wings you will find refuge;

His faithfulness is a shield. (vs. 1-4)

Those who love me, I will deliver; I will protect those who know my name.

When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble,

I will rescue them, and honor them. (vs. 14-15)

At all times in our lives, but especially in a time such as this when we are imminently threatened by severe wind and rain, we need to remember that we have a shelter – a refuge. We have our faith in a God who will watch over us.

God's shelter reminds us that although we are subject to the challenges of living in a world that includes threatening weather, we can find peace and assurance in God. We are not inoculated from the storms of life, but are given the strength to face whatever befalls us in our human existence. Psalm 91 is an affirmation of faith in a God who is with us in all aspects of our lives.

In the Psalm, God is compared to an eagle who spreads her wings and protects her young. The power in God's wings is stronger than the power of wind and rain.

We are God's hands and feet for others. We are called to reach out and offer support and protection to each other and to others. All of this is done in the name of God. Think about it – how empowering it is to know that not only are we watched over by a loving God, we have the opportunity to be there for others.

At a time like this, we act responsibly and prepare to keep ourselves physically safe in ways that we are instructed. But even more crucial to our survival is the assurance of God's care which supports us and gives us strength to support others and keeps us from panic. When we open ourselves to God's refuge, we have the gift of shalom – God's peace, even in the face of physical danger. Our spirits remain secure. Thanks be to God!

This is my prayer for you during this challenging week: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you; the Lord lift up the light of His Countenance upon you and give you peace." Amen.
